



***Duc in Altum* Youth Retreat Code of Conduct**

Retreatant Agreement

Attendees understand that this is a spiritual retreat, and they will attend with a mature, Christian attitude.

Attendees agree to:

- Respect the property of other people and of the Apostolate for Family Consecration®.
- Obey retreat leaders, including Catholic Corps Members, AFC Staff, retreat speakers, and parent chaperones or drivers.
- Act and speak to others with respect.
- Abide by all the guidelines set for the retreat.
- Accept appropriate responsibility for their behavior.

Attendees are aware that:

- Engaging in any unlawful conduct, such as the possession and use of drugs and/or alcohol, or providing drugs and/or alcohol to another retreatant, is unacceptable.
- Verbal and/or physical bullying of another person will not be tolerated.
- Retreat leaders will be responsible for the application and interpretation of this code of conduct.
- The Apostolate for Family Consecration is offering simultaneous retreats for young men and young women, and there will not be any interaction between the two.
- Attendees will be asked to go home if they choose not to follow this agreement.

Attendees want to attend this retreat. They are not being forced or coerced in any way; it is their own free choice.

Parent Agreement

Attendee's parent knows that if the attendee does not abide by the above "Retreatant Code of Conduct Agreement" for the duration of the retreat he/she may be asked to go home early. Parent acknowledges that if their child is asked to leave, they are responsible for ensuring that he/she has a ride home.
